Address to the Keeper of the LOG, name of nominee, address, phone nos, email, spouse, etc. Give a brief summary of Jaycee Career (note: ones credentials for consideration for admission to the CREW of the SS Fellowship are based primarily on ones Jaycee Career and very little to do with ones JCI Senate Career) and dates including National, State, and Local Chapter Offices held, awards, etc. Post Jaycee Career including JCI Senate, Jaycee Foundations and Alumni Groups such as Corps, etc. Name of Nominator, Signature of Nominator and Date signed by the nominator. The CREW nominator should make a check payable to "The CREW of the SS Fellowship" (for an amount of \$100 or more but may consider less), which accompanies the nomination of a new Mate to the CREW. This has been customary since the inception of The CREW of the SS Fellowship. NOTE: Remember one cannot buy ones way into the CREW of the SS Fellowship and must be nominated by a current Mate. The accompanying check must be from the nominator for an amount of \$100 or more but will consider less and signed by the nominator, not the nominee. He was elected an Outstanding Young Man of FL and of the U.S. He was a FL JCI Senator and was 101 years old last July.

Owensboro, KY Mate Wendell Ford who was Past US Jaycee National President, 1956/67 and US Senator from Kentucky passed away on January 22, 2015 at the age of 90. Mr. Ford served 24 years in the U.S. Senate and was governor from 1971 to 1974. After the war, he became active in the Junior Chamber of Commerce, known as the Jaycees, serving as president of the Owensboro chapter, the Kentucky Jaycees, and, in 1956-57, the US Jaycees. The Jaycees posts raised his profile in Kentucky and led to his first job in state government, as chief assistant to Gov. Bert T. Combs from 1959 to 1961. His network of Jaycees colleagues throughout the state helped him in his first political race for the State Senate in 1965. He was elected after winning the Democratic primary by 305 votes. Two years later, he was elected lieutenant governor after winning that primary by 631 votes. He served under a Republican governor, Louie B. Nunn. Sen. Ford is survived by his wife, Jean; his children, Shirley Dexter and her husband, Bill, and Steven M. Ford and his wife, Sarah.
